If you have concerns:

Call 999- if there is immediate danger to someone, crime is in progress, you need police help immediately, someone is using violence or threatening violence, serious damage is or could be used to property, a potential criminal has been disturbed or stopped.

Call 101- to report a crime that has already happened, seek crime prevention advice or make the police aware of any policing issues in your area.

Suffolk Turning Point

Suffolk Recovery Network is the integrated substance misuse service for the county. They work with anyone who is affected by drugs or alcohol and wants support to make change. They offer a variety of treatment options and will support you to find the right treatment for you.

Regardless of your age, we have a service which will meet your needs. For young people up to their 25th birthday, the dedicated youth team will work one to one with you in any location that is suitable.

The team across Suffolk includes doctors, nurses, psychologists, recovery workers, support workers, peer mentor volunteers, and trainers. There are lots of different people who can offer their support, knowledge and encouragement to help you achieve your recovery.
